Cass County youth Draft Horse Evaluation / Workbook Guidelines

This is a mandatory part of the Cass County Youth Draft Horse project. All workbooks must be completed and handed in to the youth superintendent by the last required workout at the fairgrounds. Exhibitors will be divided into age groups according to showmanship classes:

Senior Evaluation – 15 years of age and over
Intermediate Evaluation – 12 to 14 years of age
Beginner Evaluation – 11 years of age and under

- The workbook must be completed in ink and in its entirety.
- Each exhibitor should submit the workbook and all attachments to the youth superintendent in a three ring binder. Each year the exhibitor is in the project, they will add to the binder.

- Each exhibitor is required to compose a research paper on one of the following topics:
- There will be a word minimum for each age group:

Seniors – 400 word minimum
Intermediates – 250 word minimum
Beginners – 100 word minimum

- Exhibitors must choose a new topic each year they are involved in the project.
- ***NO PLAGERISM!***

Objectives of the Youth Draft Horse Project

- To develop leadership, initiative, self-reliance, and sportsmanship.
- To experience the pride and responsibility of owning a horse and to learn about the care, feeding, management, and how to maintain the health of the animal.
- To learn safety precautions to prevent injuries to themselves, to others, and to their animal.
- To prepare for citizenship responsibilities by working together in groups and supporting community projects and activities.
- To appreciate a draft horse as a healthy and wholesome form of recreation, as well as to gain an appreciation of our conservation and natural resources through draft horses.

*NOTE: Exhibitors are urged to own their own horses, but it is not required
Records should be kept in accordance with county requirements.*

Why should I keep records?

Careful record keeping helps to answer all of the "hard-to-answer" questions at a moment's notice.

Properly kept records will give you a clear picture of what you have done in your horse project work. In fact, at the end of the year, you will have solid facts rather than haphazard "guesstimates".

**Remember: Records are not only for your benefit...
They are the key to your horse's future!**
